# Thoughts from the Rabbi...

# Circles of friendship and community; celebrations and sorrows

As we move into the darker months of winter and think about the candles of Hanukkah (and the lights of many other faith communities) we can recall the verse in Proverbs that "Ner Adonai nishmat



adam ..., The human soul is the candle of Adonai" (Proverbs 20). There is a brightness to the human spirit, and it is our presence in the world, and our presence for and with each

other that spreads Divine Light in the world. Within the Beth Israel community, I have come to see the many interwoven "candles of God" in the intersecting circles of the life of the diverse people who make up our congregation. The gatherings for daily minyan, for Shabbat services, for learning and governing, for funding and building, for strengthening the Jewish People and caring for those in need allow us to see, almost, the Divine sparks in the souls of those gathered for any aspect of the holy work of being part of synagogue community.

I have personally felt blessed to share in more than a few celebrations, and of course in a good handful of Jewish Festivals. Seeing children growing up and marking the occasion of Bar/Bat Mitzvah, grandparents kvelling over grandchildren, and "significant" birthdays and anniversaries (whether or not the precise number is announced) has offered me other portals into the lives of the families in our community.

There are many opportunities for simple and surface chat and conversation. Gathering in sacred community, in sacred space, invites us to strive for the higher form of encounter described so lyrically by Martin Buber the meeting of "I and Thou." Meeting and interaction where the "other" is felt and perceived in depth, as fully human, as carrying the Divine Image. In every blessing we begin, in addressing God with the words Barukh ata - Blessed are You ... an intimate and profound pathway to relationship. Perhaps we can strive to make our meetings, our conversations, our deliberations more filled with that spirit, of "I and Thou."

Of course we cannot meet every need, but the Candle of God is inside each of us - a gentle and flickering flame. Let us nourish that spark in ourselves and within the widening circles of our family, our community and our world.

#### Psalms on the Ice

One of the real perks for me of moving to Wisconsin when I was young and carefree was the winter weather. I'd been living in Baltimore for five years, and I found the climate far too steamy for my tastes. I reveled in gearing up and getting out into the frigid nights, skiing with friends to the middle of the lake or gathering around a campfire, trading stories and a warm glass of brandy. # Shmirat Beiteinu---Caring for our Home

One of the committees I have the pleasure of working with is the BIC House Committee, currently chaired by VP-



House Steve Goldstein. One of Steve's first orders of business when he became our new House VP just over a year ago was to assemble a committee of

thoughtful, dedicated people who could work together to identify and prioritize the many projects and ongoing care and maintenance tasks that will keep our beautiful shul looking great and meeting our needs. They also roll up their sleeves and do much of the work themselves.

Here is some of what the House Committee has been up to lately:

Howard Bregman has organized fall, spring and summer yard work days, bringing together congregants to help care for our grounds and plantings. (If you're reading this in time, come on Sunday, November 5, between 10:30 and 12:30.)

Sue Shafer-Landau, who also served on the 2012-14 Building Committee, is leading an effort to identify which furnishings from our 2014 wish list (placed there to keep the construction project on budget) belong at the top of the wish list. As part of that effort, she recently proposed that we make greater use of our 3rd floor meeting/classroom,

moving some existing furniture there and creating a space for adult education programs and meetings of more than 8-10 people (a size that fits nicely in our conference room). The House Committee and Board embraced this proposal, and we began taking steps toward making it a reality just after the fall holidays.

Jeff Lindholm has been helping me evaluate some of our larger service contracts

The Art & Interiors subcommittee is collecting photographs and artifacts that tell some of our congregational history. If you have items that may be of interest as this project takes shape, please contact me or, even better, speak to David Balkansky, Sally Schrag, Sue Shafer-Landau, Lisa Shoshany-Anderson or Jim Wear (the subcommittee working on this project). Help make history at Beth Israel Center.

Last but not least, as you may have heard about at the Annual Meeting or from President Matt Banks in his annual Kol Nidre address, Steve spearheaded an effort to install solar panels on the roof of the synagogue, an investment that should significantly reduce our energy bills and allow us to contribute to our community's power supply.

It's truly gratifying to see all the wonderful things our congregation can accomplish when we work together.

# From the Education Director's Desk

Talmud Torah Faculty: Building a Community

One of the things of which I am most proud in my 11 years as the Education Director at Beth Israel Center is the growth we have seen in our faculty. Though I have always been very impressed by the commitment that undergraduates made to our children and to their jobs here, not too long ago our Talmud Torah faculty was a revolving door. Teachers would stay for a semester or a year and then move on. In the last 7 or so years, this has changed and we've seen more and more teachers finding us early in their college careers and staying with us for 3 or 4 (or more!) years. We have a very strong teacher supervision program, which allows our teachers to work with me, individually, in small groups, or as a faculty to understand the art and science of teaching, plan engaging lessons, interpret what is happening in their classrooms and immerse themselves in Torah lishmah, Jewish learning for its own sake. We are now known on campus as a good, comfortable place to teach and practice teaching.

It turns out that building a strong teaching community doesn't just benefit our Talmud Torah program and synagogue community, but the greater Jewish community and the individuals who comprise our faculty. I recently reached out to several of our teachers from years past. I was astonished by how much they look back on and use what they learned as young teachers in Talmud Torah in their lives as Jewish adults and community members today. Eliana Weber Bernard, a Talmud Torah teacher from 2009-2013, says that she "enjoyed watching the students learn and find connections with their Jewish heritage. They challenged me with questions I hadn't thought to answer before. Through their curiosity they developed a stronger understanding of who they were as Jewish individuals." She is now teaching 4th grade in a secular school in Massachusetts while also doing online tutoring in Hebrew and Jewish

studies. Maya Doron, on faculty from 2011-2015, told me that she "learned extremely valuable skills while working

at Talmud Torah.

plans] allowed me
to grow as a
teacher. When I cotaught, I learned
about teamwork and
balancing one
another's strengths



and weaknesses. The skills I learned as a Hebrew teacher have helped me in law school; I have worked in firms where my responsibilities were to explain the law to people who have never been exposed to the legal system. In essence I am teaching those who need legal assistance. Talmud Torah taught me the importance of patience and understanding."

Our transition to a Shabbat-centered model means that our teachers are here interacting with congregants and families regularly. Our teachers now sit at lunch and play Jewish geography with our members. They discuss their classes and post-college plans with congregants who are interested and able to help with networks and connections. Our congregants reach out to our teachers to provide them a Jewish family away from home-- with invitations to Shabbat dinner, making sure they have a place to sit at Kol Nidre and Neilah and, of course, babysitting opportunities. We are building relationships with our teachers as friends and community members before sending them out into the big Jewish world. We are modeling a functional, supportive Jewish community in which people want to participate. We are, without thinking about it much, providing a foundation for the Jewish community of the future.

# Making the Minyan

Maintaining a daily minyan, particularly for those who are in mourning or marking the anniversary of a loved one's death, is important for our community. Being a part of a minyan and saying Kaddish, or being counted in a minyan that allows a friend to say Kaddish, makes us a link in a spiritual chain. We come together to recognize these losses through words that have been uttered for this purpose for two millennia. The essence of our daily prayers is to renew our connection to God, including in moments of loss and times of gratitude.

While many of us can relate to these thoughts and understand them as ideals and even core values of a traditional Jewish community, very few of us — often fewer than the required 10 to say Kaddish — regularly attend our

weekday morning and evening minyanim at Beth Israel.

Many congregants have said they'll come when they know they're needed. To let each member know when s/he is particularly needed, we are asking each family to send at least one Jewish adult (over 13) to our morning and evening minyanim as often as possible during two assigned calendar weeks each year, beginning on Sunday and ending with Shabbat. Assignments are mailed out 4-6 weeks in advance with an email reminder the week before your assigned week. They are also posted on our website, and our office has a listing.

If you are unavailable during your week, consider swapping with a friend, or pick another week that works better for you.

Please come. You are needed.

# Rabbi Search Committee Update

Our rabbi search for this year officially began on October 19, when we submitted our congregational profile to the placement office of the Rabbinical Assembly. This document, which describes our community in detail, provides the information and background that is reviewed by potential candidates for our position. While the core of our congregational profile is the same as last year (we have a great synagogue and community!), we have benefited substantially from insights gained in last year's search, feedback from the congregation, and perspectives shared with us by with Rabbi Sami Barth. These insights led us to reframe some aspects of our profile. Rabbi Barth's input has been especially valuable. Since his work with us began, Rabbi Barth has been supportive of and engaged with our efforts to identify a candidate through the open search procedure that the Board of Directors laid out. The Rabbi Search Committee is grateful to him for sharing his insight and experience in the search process.

The membership of the Rabbi Search Committee represents diverse constituencies of our *kahal* (congregation), and has a wide range of perspectives to consider while carrying out its charge from the Board. All members of the committee are in agreement regarding the importance of spiritual leadership, scholarship and pastoral care in any rabbinical candidate we would consider.

About one-third of the way into our year with Rabbi Barth, as often happens with well regarded interim rabbis, some of us wondered if we might find a way for him to stay longer than planned. However, as a consultant to the search process, and for other reasons, Rabbi Barth does not consider himself an applicant for the position. He will continue working with the committee and the congregation to help us undertake a successful search this year.

The search process that began a year and a half ago has been an overwhelmingly positive experience for the congregation. The level of engagement we have seen from our community is the mark of a healthy congregation in which each member's voice is heard and every perspective valued. We look forward to working together to achieve what is best for our community, and hearing your thoughts on the candidates we will be interviewing in the coming months.

Please continue to share your questions, concerns and feedback during this important time in the life of our congregation.
